With further planting on our side in the borders we hope that this work will make the club grounds look much improved and the envy of many.

Number Crunching

At the AGM on 8th February the Board presented the accounts for year ending 30th September 2009, which showed a profit improvement on the 2008 year. Not an unusual event in itself but given the economic climate throughout the whole of that year it is a great credit to Robert and Denis and their staff that the club continues to thrive.

We had a turnover of £312,000 and returned a surplus of 5% for the year. The club now has working capital of £65,000 and we have set a budget for 2010 to (at least) break even in order to try and maintain our reserves going forward.

Results in tough times don't happen by accident and you will all be pleased to hear that Robert has a keen eye for cost control, cash and margin-management. We are all very mindful that whilst the club is currently on a strong financial footing we need to continue to strive to provide facilities and events members enjoy. We are all too aware that we could spend our reserves very quickly on one problem with our historic building.

Despite the challenge of the general economy with your support and the effort of Robert and his staff the club is looking forward to the new decade with as much vigour as it has for the previous 125 years.

A Club Tradition continues



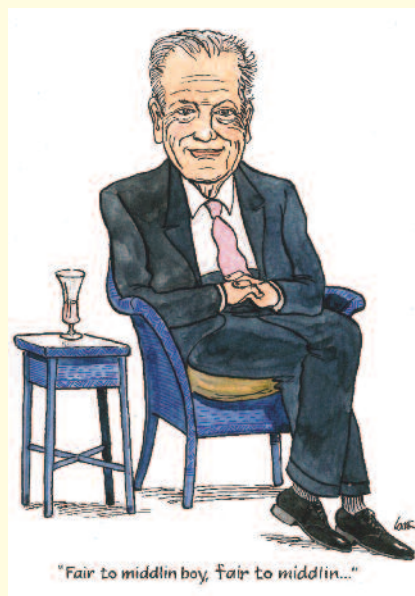
For many years the Club bar has displayed a large selection of artist's caricatures of prominent members (mostly now sadly no longer with us.)

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Parking Update

No doubt all members are delighted with the steady increase in the numbers of people using the club facilities. However, this does mean that there is an inevitable increase in pressure upon parking spaces, particularly at busy times.

So in order to protect this important facility for legitimate members, the Board has found it necessary to tighten up on policing the car park and to that effect, unfortunately this means that penalty notices issued will now in all cases have to be charged.

These may include:

1. Parking without a valid car permit. **(Please therefore always inform Robert of any change of car or use of temporary loan cars).**
2. Members loaning their legitimate car to non-members who subsequently use the car park. (This is a particular problem with sons/daughters using the car park in their parent's car – **please be aware that the permit is both vehicle and member specific**).
3. Full-time parking members allowing non members to “use their parking space” while they do not need it. (Full-time parking offers **the holder in person** the right to park his car, and does not confer a permanent space upon the permit holder to lend to another while the member is away.

Club and Parking Rules can be found on the Club Notice Board and in the Manager's office and Robert and the Team would be most grateful for members' support in this matter.
