Stepping down after years and years of office as board members are the Club's very own Laurel and Hardy, Basil Tenwick and Standley Gaskin.



I look forward to enjoying the future of, and at, the Club.




Pauline Young takes over as Ipswich & Suffolk Club President.

Our financial year started well in October with the team hitting the ground running thanks in no small part to the number of private functions having increased after many referrals.

This has snowballed into more weddings booked for this year which is very helpful for our refurbishment program. The team also enjoys the challenge of organising a wedding as it brings another dimension to our working life.

Ipswich & Suffolk Club Financial Report for Year to September 2016

It is my pleasure to have reported to the AGM that we had another solid financial performance for the year to September 2016. It has not been a year without its challenges and we must all again thank Robert and his team for the sterling work they put in to achieve the result.

One particular challenge we face at the moment is that of increased wage costs primarily driven by upward movement in the living wage and auto enrolment.

This increased cost is felt more in our catering operation given that we have a fixed cost at lunch time, which then cannot be recovered easily given the unpredictable levels of income we achieve. For example, we have within the catering figures achieved a 3% increase in function income but suffered a 3% decline in lunch income.

We continue to maintain strong reserves in the Club which we hope will be enough to sustain our Club and in particular our fantastic building.

To give you a feel for the type of repair problem we have in the Club, you will see a notice soon to the effect that we

are attempting to agree a solution to one of the long running repairs required to the largest of our chimneys, hence why we retain reserves at the level we do.

We currently hold any cash reserves built up at subscription time in cash deposit and, the total cash balance at the end of September of £360,000, is a good indicator of the peak balance. The low point of our cash is just over the £100,000 level in August and this is effectively our buffer against surprise costs.

A point was raised at the AGM as to whether we should attempt to manage and return any surplus above this buffer. The difficulty here is that with extra return comes risk and liquidity issues but we have taken the point to the Board for future discussion alongside looking at long term projects internally to boost income wherever possible.

All in all another great year managed by Robert and his team and the Club is in good health for your future enjoyment.

The Steve Croucher annual trophy for the player with the best results this year




